Our RE topics from the 'Come and See' scheme this term will be:


- Transformation

Our Curriculum

Our history topic for this half term is Journeys (Migration to Britain). Within this topic, we will learn about migration from Ireland in the 19th and 20th centuries, the migration of the Windrush generations as well as the movement of refugees in the 20th and 21st centuries.

In science, we are finishing our topic of Materials and their Properties. We will be learning about irreversible and reversible changes as well as applying our learning to decide which materials should be used for different jobs. We will then follow this with our topic of Living Things.

In the second half term our geography topic will be Climate Change and Pollution. Within this topic, we will learn about the causes and impact of global warming.



English

This term we will be writing: formal and informal letters, palindrome poems and balanced arguments linked to our Journeys topic. Next half term we will be writing: diaries and persuasive posters liked to our Climate Change topic.

Our class text is 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' by Onjali Q. Raúf. We will also be sharing a range of other texts in our reading for pleasure time.

Please continue to support your child in practising the year 5 and 6 spelling lists, talking to them about books and listening to them read.

How can you help your child at home?

Children should be reading at home **EVERY** day. It is very important that you read with your children at home and make a note in their Homework Diary.

If you have written a message in your child's Homework Diary, please ask your child to show it to a staff member.

Please practise the KIRFs sent home each half term, with your child. Times tables should be practised on Times Tables Rock Stars regularly.
