### Governor News... an update from Rebecca Burke, our Chair of Governors

As part of our safeguarding role, governors recently met with pupils to discover how safe children feel in our school. We performed an exercise called "Hotspot Mapping" with pupils from each year group.

Using a map of the school, which incorporated classrooms and the playground, pupils placed coloured stickers in locations where they felt unsafe or unhappy. They used red dots where they felt there were problem areas (e.g. a blind corner in the playground, toilets etc.) yellow dots where they felt there was potential for a problem, and green dots in the areas they felt "safe".

The pupils thoroughly enjoyed the exercise and shared lots of interesting information.

Feedback was then given to staff, allowing them to form a clearer understanding of any safeguarding issues from the perspective of our pupils. Mrs Toner also shared the information and possible solutions with all the children during an assembly, and teachers followed this up in class during PSHE lessons.

The exercise was part of a comprehensive Safeguarding Audit that we undertake on behalf of the Trust, and due to the success of the "Hotspot Mapping" exercise, we all agreed that it is definitely something that we will continue annually.

#### **Summer Fayre**

Our annual Summer Fayre is fast approaching on 1st July! Hopefully you have received a letter home with your child with details of the raffle – top prize being a holiday for up to 8 people in Haven, Yorkshire – very generously donated by one of our families.
