Home Learning

Reading

Please ensure that your child's reading books and diary are in their folder and brought to school **every** day. Remember to sign/comment in the diary every time you have heard them read. We will change your child's books and hear them read in school once a week.

Phonics

Phonics work is key to developing your child's ability to read and write and this is why we focus, at first, on teaching the children letter sounds rather than the letter names. More information will be given at the 'Meet the Teacher' evening.
