

In Maths this term we will be doing:

English

Our main texts for the Lent Term will be:

Music

They have been looking at musical notation and how to write music. This term children will cover graphic scores and country music.

Geography: earthquakes, volcanoes and tectonic plates


Design and Technology: sewing - design and make a textile pencil case.

Homework

- Reading Children need to read for 15 minutes each night and at least twice a week to an adult. This can be their colour banded book or any other suitable reading material. Children need to record the name of the book and the pages they have read.
- Spellings Spellings will be sent home on a Friday and children should write a definition for each word in their homework book. Spellings will be taught throughout the week in school.
- Daily times tables Children should be accessing TT Rock stars each day at home. Heat maps will be sent home to show progress.
- Maths and wider curriculum task This will be sent home every Friday, to be returned the following Friday. Work sent home will be linked to the week's Maths lessons and children should spend no more than 20 minutes on this.

supporting your child at home

- 1. Listen to your child read at least twice a week, discuss their reading and make a note in their organiser.
