Understanding and helping others

We have been learning about our own emotions during the Advent term. We are now going to learn how to spot how others might be feeling and how we can look after each other. We will play bingo with emotion cards and have a colour monster check in point.

RE

Our first topic this half term is 'Celebrating.' We will be talking about the times our children have gathered with their families to celebrate special occasions such as their own and other's birthdays. We will think about celebrations experienced in church. We will then move onto the topic 'gathering', looking at the special features in church and how we celebrate during mass. We look forward to giving the

children the opportunity to talk to Father Philipp and give him a flower arrangement we have made for him to take back to Church. Please encourage your child to look at paintings, statues and the altar area in church during family visits. Our Liturgical prayer is the bible story Jonah and the Whale. We will link this to our school value: Show mercy. We will learn that God and Jesus loves everyone. He will always forgive us when we make mistakes.

We love reading

This half term we will be reading books that link to our local community. They include:

We will be learning about our local community: what is within it, all the places and people we might see. Locations and maps link

This half term is a perfect opportunity to explore maps and locations around our school and homes. We will follow a map of our school to find Mrs Toner's office, a map of our community, to locate the bakers shop, the helicopter park and church. We will be building our local community at the construction area with

mini me's and the children's roads signs and shop names. To end the topic we will visit the helicopter park with the Year 6 children.

Magical Maths

We are going to learn some super skills this half term. We are going to get our thinking caps on to construct people and places in our comminity. We will also build buses, trams and trains with the large crates outside. We will select shapes appropriately: flat surfaces for building, a triangular prism for a roof etc.

Our key rhyme for this half term is: 5 current buns in a bakers shop.



We will learn the rhyme really well and explore lots of counting skills including subitising and careful counting up to 5. We will spend time exploring numerals and amounts: for example, showing the right number of objects to match the numerals up to 5. At the end of the half term we will visit the cake shop on Thursday 8th
February. Any volunteers to help would be greatly appreciated. We will be leaving after registration at 9 am. We would also like any volunteers to come in and bake with the children? Do you have any family recipes you are willing to share? Please speak to Miss Kendrick or Mrs Dickson if you would like to come in.

Writing

The children have become confident writers and are starting to give meaning to their marks. On a daily basis, our writing basket is full of letters, messages, cards and lists. It's superb! To build on this, we are looking at the marks we are making in greater depth. We will focus on getting a strong pencil grip and how to correctly write the letters in our names. We will also be spending time drawing with increasingly complexity and detail. Such as representing the characters from our stories. We will also begin to look at initial sounds of words 'b for biscuit, looks like this.; The children will be introduced to an alphabet card. Our class one is attached to this newsletter so you can play 'I spy' with class friends!

Getting our groove on!

We love to get the disco ball out and have a good dance! During our PE sessions, we are going to skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues. We are going to



develop our dance skills and be able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music, we are going to learn Nanny Knowles' favourite 'Agadoo.'

Flying Fridays

The children can bring their own bikes and scooters every Friday to practise their balancing and riding skills on the big playground. We have Nursery bikes so do not worry if you don't have one. Please ensure all bikes and scooters are safe for riding and the children bring their helmets to wear.

Painting

The children have already learned a lot about paint brushes and different strokes. We are now moving on to different painting techniques including: bubble painting, string painting, marble painting, printing and scraping. We will also be looking at joining materials at the workshop.
