#### First Reconciliation and Holy Communion







For those of you who would like your child to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion this academic year, there will be a parents' meeting with Fr Philipp and the catechists on Wednesday 16th October at 7pm in the parish centre. At this meeting, you will hear about the programme and what commitment is required from you and your children.

You will have the opportunity to sign up to the programme at this meeting, or alternatively after mass over the following 3 weekends. Please note that all those who wish to receive the sacraments will need to attend the children's enrolment mass on Sunday 1st December where the Good Shepherd School will be leading the Liturgy of the Word.

Please note that the date for Holy Communion is Saturday 21st June 2025. First Reconciliation will take place over the first three Saturdays in Lent – 8th to 22nd March.

We hope you can join us for our 'Tea and Talk' event after pick up on 10th October in recognition of World Mental Health Day.
