Welcome to the Lent term of Year 5. We are really proud of how well the children are working and look forward to exciting opportunities in the term ahead!

Mathematics

We follow the White Rose program at Good Shepherd. We practise fluency before tackling problems, with a focus on providing reasoning and depth of understanding. This term we are focusing on: fractions, multiplication and division, decimals and percentages, area and perimeter and statistics.

Knowing basic times tables and division facts are vital to year 5, please support your child in practising these regularly.

RE

This term in RE, our topics are called 'Mission', 'Memorial Sacrifice' and 'Sacrifice'.

The children also have regular opportunities to plan and take part in class Liturgical Prayer based on the values of our School Mission Statement.

As part of the Jubilee Year of Hope, Year 5 will be raising awareness and supporting the homeless. We will also be going on a pilgrimage to St Barnabas Cathedral in town with a date to be confirmed. Please keep an eye out for further details.

Our Wider Curriculum

In Science this term, we will be studying the properties of materials. We will learn about the states of matter as well as how to group different materials based on their properties. We will also learn about dissolving, mixing and changes of state.

Our History topic this half term is the Anglo-Saxon and Viking struggle for the Kingdom of England. During this topic, we will have the opportunity to explore artefacts. We will also learn about the balance of power between the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings within Britain. Finally, we will focus on the end of the Anglo-Saxon and Viking period in Britain.

Later this term our Geography topic is mountains. Within this topic, we will learn about how different mountains form and key details about the Seven Summits of the world.

This half term in Art, we will be creating clay dragon eyes inspired by Viking mythology. Later this term in D&T, we will be creating pulley systems as part of the Squashed Tomato Challenge.



English

This term we will be kennings and warning stories linked to our Vikings topic. Next half term we will be writing explanation texts linked to our mountains topic. We will also be reading and writing a piece of work based on the book: 'Wild Planet' for World Book Week.

Our class texts are 'Beowulf' by Michael Morpurgo, The Saga of Erik the Viking' by Terry Jones and 'Mountains' by Dieter Braun.

Please continue to support your child by talking to them about books and listening to them read.

Homework

Children should be reading at home **every** day for 15 - 20 minutes. Times tables should be practised daily. Children have their login details for Times Tables Rock Stars in their organiser.

As well as daily reading and times tables, children will receive weekly spellings, a maths task, and a spelling, punctuation and grammar task.

Homework and spellings will be given out on a **Thursday** and completed homework books are to be returned the following **Tuesday**. We will learn spellings through the week with a quiz on a Thursday.
