## **World Book Day**

We had lots of fun celebrating World Book Day (WBD) yesterday – many thanks to Mrs Moore for organising such a great day and for wrapping all those books to enable every child to take home a new book yesterday!

For WBD this year across school, we are studying Wild Planet – a picture book that celebrates the life and work of Sir David Attenborough. This book serves to raise awareness and hope about the importance of 'rewilding' and restoring harmony to our planet. Our school theme for March is Creation. Each class are using the book as stimulus for creative writing, as it links to our Year of Service and Pilgrims of Hope mission. Children will be encouraged to look after our 'Common Home' and to be good stewards, by 'Loving Jesus in all we do'.
