In Maths this term we will be doing:

We will have time each day in school to practise on TT Rock Stars and we ask that you also encourage this at home. We continue to do weekly 1-minute times tables tests and number fact activities to support in the learning of times tables. We will be sending worksheets home to practise too!

English

Whole class reading takes place throughout the course of the week and is based on our class text and model texts. We continue to encourage reading for pleasure and a selection of reading for pleasure books are available in each classroom.

We will also continue to revise the spelling, punctuation and grammar for Year 4 and focus on the spelling of the Year 3 / 4 Common Exception Words.

- TIMES TABLES - Our focus for this half term is times tables. Children should access TTRS and complete the given sheets.
- SPELLINGS – we ask that children practise their spellings each week. Spellings link to the Year 3 and 4 Common Exception Words and the spelling patterns that the children should be using in their writing by the end of Year 4. The words sent home to learn are words that the children are expected to be able to use in their written work.
- READING - Children need to read for 20 minutes **each night**. This can be their colour banded book or any other suitable reading material. Children need to record the name of the book and the pages they have read. Please sign or comment in your child's organiser every week, when you have listened to them read.
- There will be no additional homework sent out until after the times table check.
